ESTABLISHMENT.

In accordance with Circ.Memo.D.A.G., A.I.F., 25/216 (Appendix A.) this School was established at Cheshunt College, Cambridge, and opened at noon on 7.10.18. The objects of the School were:-

- (a) To afford all prospective Education Officers as wide a training as possible in the administrative duties of Education Officers.
- (b) To imbue these officers with a full appreciation of the spirit of the Education Service, its aims and methods.
- (c) To draw up syllabuses of study in all subjects coming within the legitimate field of activity of the Education Service: fix examination standards: and decide on text and reference books to be used.
- (d) To reawaken, by lectures on matters of national importance by recognised experts, a keen intellectual appreciation of the problems of the day.

CONSTITUTION.

The personnel at the School consisted of:-

- (a) Staff.
 - (b) Students.
 - (c) O/Rs. attached for duty.)
-) See Appendix "B".

The services of Mr. Albert Mansbridge, Advisory Expert to the British Army Education Service, having been secured for a period of three months dating from (authority) proved of great benefit to the School both as regards its inner working and the arrangement of special facilities in connection with the use of libraries etc., in the University of Cambridge.

Of the students who reported on 7.10.18, 25 were officers and 23 were other ranks (aspirant officers). During the course of the School the following additional members reported from units

subject. A detailed statement of the qualifications of each member of the School will be found in Appendix F.

On each group devolved the duty of drawing up complete syllabuses of study for the subject or subjects in which its members were specialists, see Appendix "F".

The various groups and the members of groups together with the special subjects with which each group dealt are set forth in Appendix "F" attached.

The results of this work will appear later as the standardised syllabuses of study to be followed in particular subjects throughout the whole of the A.I.F. Education Service.

CAMBRIDGE UNIVERSITY, &c.

Mention must be made of the assistance received in every way from this University and its members. In addition to allowing members of this School unrestricted admission to the Cambridge University Library, various departmental libraries and special schools offered every facility to assist the members of the School in their undertakings. The Cambridge School of Arts and Crafts, Dr. Rouse, Principal of Perse School, Messrs. Heffer & Sons, Booksellers, also afforded valuable assistance.

HOSPITALITY, SPORTS, &c.

The Staff and members of the School were officially welcomed to the University and Town of Cambridge by the acting Vice Chancellor, the President of Queen's and His Worship the Mayor, the Master of Corpus respectively.

Hospitality was generously extended to the Staff and members of the School by the President of Queen's, the Master and Lady Thomson of Trinity, the Master of Downing, the Master of Emanuel, the Master of Corpus and many others.

Lady Darwin acted as hostess on behalf of the Staff and members of the School at an "At Home" held in the College Buildings on the night of 19.10.18. Early in the Session a Sports Committee was elected and the use of tennis courts in Caius College Grounds secured; in addition material for indoor recreation was provided. By the courtesy of the Master of Trinity two visits of inspection were paid to this College. Ely Cathedral was visited on 27.10.18

Of the grand total, 22 officers and 18 Cadets were from Units in France, and 6 officers and 10 O/Rs. were from camps, hospitals and depots in England.

By authority A.I.F. Order List 399 all other ranks in attendance at the School were promoted cadets dating from 7.10.18. An analysis of the daily strength, showing arrivals and departures, will be found in Appendix "C" attached.

TIMETABLE OF STUDIES.

In Appendix "D". attached will be found a detailed account of the lectures given and work done in the School during this session.

The work carried out at the School may be divided into sections:-

- (a) Lectures.
- (b) Compilation of Syllabuses.

LECTURES.

In addition to the lectures delivered by the members of the Staff and members of the School, on subjects closely related to the Education Service, its development and its future activities, a number of lectures were delivered by well known authorities on matters of relevant interest to aspirant educationalists. In Appendix "E" will be found a detailed list of these lecturers and the titles of lectures given.

SYLLABUSES.

In the compilation of the syllabuses of study, the services of the whole of the members of the School were enlisted. The personnel of the School was divided up into groups, each group composed of experts in particular subjects or aspects of the

During the last week of the course the syllabuses and reports presented by the group leaders were discussed by the whole school and assumed a finalised form.

The course closed on Wednesday 30.10.18.

Twenty seven cadets of the twenty eight in attendance received temporary commissions as Education Officers (Authority A.I.F. List No. 405) and they and the twenty eight officers in attendance were appointed to units in France and England as shown in appendix "H".

The remaining cadet undertook a second course.

1. It has been decided to appoint an Education Officer for each Division, Battalion, and similar unit, Field Artillery Brigade, the Engineers of a Division, the A.A.S.C. of a Division, the A.A.S.C. (M.T.) of the A.I.F. France, and the A.A.M.C. of a Division.
2. Arrangements will be made at an early date for Education Officers to undertake also the supervision necessary for A.F.C., Railway and Tunnelling Coys., Depot units of Supply, Field Bakeries and Butcheries, General Hospitals and Casualty Clearing Stations.
3. Officers appointed to the A.I.F. Education Service will be seconded from their units and will be eligible for promotion in their turn in their units.
4. The duties of the Education Officer of a Division, Battalion and other units above referred to will be -
 - (a) To act as representative of the A.I.F. Education Service in his unit;
 - (b) To enlist the "volunteer" co-operation of men within the unit capable of conducting courses of instruction;
 - (c) To organize and co-ordinate all available means of instruction;
 - (d) To obtain through A.I.F. Education Service all text books &c. required by the men;
 - (e) To obtain information enabling men to decide upon their careers after the war, and thus to be the advance agent of the Australian Repatriation Scheme.
5. The Divisional Education Officer will generally supervise the work of Education officers within the Division.
6. A "Refresher" Training Course of Instruction for all Education Officers will be held early in the month of October to co-ordinate the plan of work throughout the A.I.F.
7. To be eligible for appointment as an Education officer an applicant must be of some standing in some branch of Education, and while it is desirable that he should have had previous teaching experience it is much more essential that he should be a man of keen and energetic character and a good organizer.
8. The rank of candidates is not to be higher than that of Captain. Preference in appointment will be given to those holding subaltern's rank, but if the most suitable in the unit is a W. or N.C.O. or Private he should be nominated. Those selected for appointment who do not already hold commissioned rank will be provisionally appointed 2nd Lieutenant, A.I.F. Education Service, which may be confirmed after three months satisfactory service.
9. It is desired that you nominate at least one candidate whom you consider suitable for appointment as an Education officer.
10. Your nominations are to be submitted in order of merit direct to the Director of Education, A.I.F., Headquarters, Australian Corps, not later than 17th September, together with the written applications of the candidates who should set out in detail their qualifications for the appointment.
11. Each unit which receives a copy of this communication if unable to submit a suitable nomination will render a nil return to the Director of Education, A.I.F.
